


Uniform Policy

Our school community fully supports the wearing of school uniform. The uniform is endorsed by the school's Parents and Citizens Association and through State Legislation (EGPA 2006). A smart school uniform helps in achieving the school's identity, cohesion, tone, pride and spirit. Wearing of a school uniform is also an important safety measure.



Additional Uniform Requirements	
Hat	School bucket hat with logo or school cap with logo. Non school hats are not permitted.
	Reck of Cap
Shoes	All black leather lace up school type or black jogger with leather upper and all-purpose sole. High-top, multi- coloured or canvas shoes of any type a not permitted.
Socks	White visible socks that cover the ankle. Three quarter crew socks are most suitable to meet this requirement.
Stockings	Winter: Stockings are optional but must be black or flesh coloured without a pattern.
Jewellery and Piercings	Jewellery is permitted however must not be excessive. A watch, 2 rings and a fine bracelet may be worn. No more than 3 earrings are permitted in each ear. A necklace may be worn however must be concealed underneath the student shirt or blouse. The wearing of jewellery must always align with professional/ industry specific standards. A nose piercing (stud only) is permitted however must be small and discrete. Other facial piercings are not permitted. X X X X X X X X X X X X X X X X X X X
Make-up	Subtle in natural skin tones.
Nails	Clear or neutral coloured polish only (natural, acrylic or gel). Nail length must align to professional/industry standards.
Hair	Hairstyle must be clean and neat, appropriate for school. Hair colour should be a natural tone.
Cultural	A Hijaab must be navy blue in colour and free of any additional dressing. Undershirts if worn must be plain and white.

Please note:

- A. If the correct uniform cannot be worn on a particular day, a parent note must be provided to Student Services explaining the reason before school starts. Students will be provided school issued uniforms for the duration of the day.
- B. Non approved clothing will remain in Student Services until the borrowed uniform is returned.
- C. Students requiring appropriate socks or shoes will be provided a school issued pair. Socks will not be required for return with the cost added to their student fees.
- D. The Education Act permits schools to issue a detention for each instance a student is not in uniform without a valid reason.
- E. If, due to unforeseen circumstances, a student is unable to wear the correct uniform for a prolonged period of time, the Year Level Dean must be contacted for alternative arrangements.
- F. Students whose appearance is unacceptable will be required to rectify the issue immediately or participate in an alternative program of study until the issue is resolved.
- G. Students must wear their formal uniform on the nominated days. Students will be informed of this in the first week of Term 1.
