- Increase the percentage of students in the Upper 2 bands to 15% for Year 9 reading.
- Achieve 98% Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) attainment and 100% Indigenous QCE attainment.
- Achieve 90% attendance
- Ensure 100% implementation of the Collegial Engagement Framework (Peer observations)
- Ensure high quality, consistent Teaching Learning Assessment Plans (TLAPs) are completed for all subjects

Our initiatives include

- Integrate technology to enhance programs utilising students' bring your own device (BYOD) tablets and IMPACT programs
- Employment of Teacher Aides with clear roles to track and support our students.
- Employment of Teacher Aide to track and publish significant outcomes
- Build on the literacy and numeracy resources.
- Implement strategies to improve attendance for all students
- Provide resources to complement the growth of students in the U2B
- Continue the Senior Outcomes team in the allocation of two coordinators
- Provide time to the school curriculum leaders to drive the implementation of literacy strategies, the implementation of our Collegial Engagement Framework (Peer Observations) and TLAP development
- Celebrate the success and growth of each student and the significant contributions by families.
